# Waynesville / St. Robert / Fort Leonard Wood Pulaski County, Missouri Demographic Profile *A place for opportunity and growth*



As part of the Fort Leonard Wood region, Waynesville and St. Robert are dynamic and fastgrowing cities in Pulaski County, Missouri. Intersected by Interstate 44 and with rail service to the north, Pulaski County is the fifth fastest growing county in Missouri, with neighboring Rolla and the Missouri University of Science and Technology (Missouri S&T) to the east and Lebanon and its manufacturing base to the west.

The County's diversified industrial base includes Fort Leonard Wood. The post is home to the Maneuver Support Center of Excellence and has an average daily population of about 34,000 people, many of whom travel from a radius of 50 miles. Fort Leonard Wood is a multi-service center of excellence primarily focused on the training and doctrine development of three regiments, including the Chemical, Biological, Radiological and Nuclear School, Engineer School and Military Police School. The post also serves as a primary motor transport school for all services, training several thousand drivers annually. The unique and diverse missions of the post bring together a wide variety of officers, NCO's and civilians from all facets of the military. The post is also home to the 4th Maneuver Enhancement Brigade which serves as a tactical umbrella for several combat units that routinely deploy to and from theaters



around the world. This environment allows the post to maintain an relevant instructional and developmental base with a tactical edge.

Fort Leonard Wood has become an integral part of the County and an active supporter of the surrounding communities. With almost 90,000 service members graduating from training every year, an average of three friends and family per trainee visit the area weekly for ceremonies.

The Leonard Wood Institute and a technology business park located on Fort Leonard Wood are together touted as the first in the nation with a unique partnership of education, military, state government and business. From start-ups to the nation's leading Fortune 500 corporations, many businesses are represented at Fort Leonard Wood and in Pulaski County.

Industry and businesses located in the area have first choice of a highly trained and disciplined workforce. Retired military, military spouses and graduates of Missouri S&T offer a wide-ranging pool of motivated and knowledgeable workers. With life style and quality of life issues becoming more important to the American worker, the low cost of living and diversified economy provide many opportunities for people and business in the Pulaski County region.

The recent 2010 census data for Pulaski County reveals that Fort Leonard Wood's population increased by 10 percent to 15,061 residents. This number accounts for approximately 29 percent of the total population figures for Pulaski County. Fort Leonard Wood trains almost 90,000 students a year, with an estimated number of approximately 255,000 visitors who attend graduation ceremonies. The average day-time population on Fort Leonard Wood averages about 34,000. The estimated economic impact of Fort Leonard Wood to the surrounding region in military spending and job employment is estimated at \$3 billion annually. The economic impact that Fort Leonard Wood has in contributing to the economic growth and sustainability of the local communities is the primary reason that the area has effectively withstood the adverse effects of the downturn in the national economic state of affairs

# **TOURISM & RECREATION**

Visitors from around the US and Europe seek out Pulaski County. This interest is attributed to military graduations and other events, Historic Rt. 66, military and civil war history, and outdoor recreation.

The Pulaski County Tourism Bureau promotes local tourism related businesses to organize group travel, regional sporting event coordinators, military reunion groups, as well as niche market groups in the following categories: outdoor recreation, history, military history, and Route 66.

The Bureau's marketing efforts consist of print media campaigns, tradeshow participation, and marketplace attendance aimed at encouraging tourism within Pulaski County. A county wide Visitor's Guide is produced annually, with 37,000 distributed in 2011.

Marketing efforts are tracked, measured, and evaluated. Visitor profiles are developed through various research programs.

The average office rank is Major with an average salary of \$83K. The average enlisted rank is Sergeant with a salary of \$36K. This does not include housing, rations, incentive pay, and benefits which vary by rank and marital status. Average government service civilian salary is \$43K for the 3766 assigned. In addition there are 5,594 other civilians employed on Fort Leonard Wood including contractors and people working for private companies. Fort Leonard Wood has an operating budget for FY12 of more than \$453 million.
