#### The Installation

- 63,270 acres of land 53,224 acres for training & 9,687 acre cantonment area with 4 access control points - Includes 35 training ranges and 89 training sites
- 45% of the installation borders the Mark Twain National Forest no encroachment, environmental, or noise concerns
- 359 acre off-post Lake of the Ozarks Recreation area operated by Morale, Welfare, & Recreation
- 6,038 feet of available runway at Forney Airfield for daily scheduled commercial jet service and military aircraft usage; joint use airport on the installation
- 27.7 miles of railway available for movement of equipment and training materials and 273 miles of road 157 paved and 116 unpaved
- 2,355 buildings on post, providing 15.4 million square feet of facilities for unique and highly technical training and support activities

#### e Vission

- 81,000+ military & civilians trained each year in active component courses & 12,000 13,000 people from 120 Reserve & other non-tenant units - Additionally, approximately 400 international students are trained here each year
- Conducts gender-integrated in-processing and Basic Combat Training for new Soldiers
- Home to three U.S. Army schools: Chemical, Biological, Radiological, and Nuclear; Engineer; and Military Police - Home of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers' Prime Power School and several deployable U.S. Army Forces Command units
- ◆ Trains all DOD Motor Transport servicemembers
- Home of the 102nd Army Reserve Training Division (Maneuver Support) and the Missouri National Guard's 35th Engineer Brigade
- Trains the largest Marine Corps contingent outside of a Marine or Naval base, as well as Air Force and Navy personnel
- Supports the Army in solving challenges including Wet Gap Crossing, Counter-Weapons of Mass Destruction/CBRN Defense and Protection
